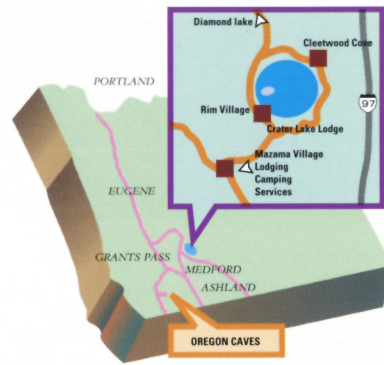

AN EASY AND SCENIC DRIVE TO REACH THE LAKE

From I-5 take the Crater Lake/Highway 62 exit in Medford. From Klamath Falls, follow Highway 97 north to Highway 62/Crater Lake Junction. When traveling southbound on Highway 97, take Highway 138 to Crater Lake National Park's north entrance. Rim Drive and the Park's north entrance are closed from October through late May. Winter access is only available to Rim Village on Highway 62.

OREGON CAVES NATIONAL MONUMENT

Another wonderful place to visit in Southern Oregon is the Oregon Caves National Monument. The main feature of the park is a marble cave that was discovered in 1874 by a hunter who followed a bear inside. It was proclaimed a National Monument in 1909. Visitors are guided through the caves to view an enchanting world of stalactites, stalagmites, flowstone and other magically beautiful formations.

The caves are open every day except Thanksgiving and Christmas. The Oregon Caves Chateau offers accommodations from mid-March through October.

Completed in 1934, it rises among waterfalls six stories above the floor of a wooded glen.

STEP INTO THE WORLD OF THE VOLCANO

No vacation in the Pacific Northwest is complete without a visit to Crater Lake. It offers a splendid family adventure. Simply to view the lake is thrilling — so beautiful and serene, yet so manifest of the awesome forces that created it. At 1,932 feet deep, the lake is the deepest in the United States and the seventh deepest in the world — a fact that especially excites the imaginations of children. Its depth and clarity account for the renowned blue brilliance of its waters.

The park offers visitors a wide array of activities and ways to enjoy the lake. Follow Rim Drive stopping at scenic viewpoints and picnicking spots. Hike spectacular nature trails to mountain peaks, through forests and meadows of wildflowers. Learn the natural history of the park from rangers, who give narrated hiking tours and evening programs at Mazama Campground. For those interested in wildlife, the park is home to a variety of animals including black bears, deer, pine martens and magnificent elk. Regularly scheduled boat excursions give you a close-up look at such lake features as Wizard Island and the Phantom Ship, plus singularly impressive views of the caldera from 800 to almost 1,900 feet down inside.

The park is open year-round. During the winter months, deep snows magically transform the vista, and scenic trails make it a cross-country skier's paradise.

VISITOR FACILITIES AND SERVICES

To make your visit all the more memorable

Mazama Village is located seven miles from Rim Village, near the park's south entrance. Open May through October, it offers a grocery store, gasoline, public showers and laundry. It also features the 40-unit Mazama Village Motor Inn and a 198-space campground. Campground spaces are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Rim Village, located on the south side of the lake, is open year-round except for Christmas Day. It offers a variety of dining options, from fast food and pizza, to cafeteria-style breakfasts, lunches and dinners. The Watchman Eatery and Lounge offers a full lunch and dinner menu. It features sit-down, family-style dining, and cocktails are served. Also located at Rim Village is the Gift Store where you can find Northwest crafts and park souvenirs. In the winter months, the cafeteria and gift store remain open, along with a ski shop for cross country ski equipment and snowshoe rentals.

Crater Lake Lodge reopens for the '95 season!

The Lodge, located at Rim Village, is open from mid-May to mid-October. Built between 1909 and 1924, it was closed in 1989, having suffered damage from years of deep snows. Now fully restored, it offers guests a wonderful overnight experience. After a day in the

mountain air has whetted your appetite, enjoy elegant dining featuring the best of Northwest cuisine. Relax by the fireside in the Great Hall and let its rustic ambience take you to a bygone era. From the terrace, watch the setting

sun work its magic on the caldera rim, and then spend a cozy night in one of the Lodge's 71 guest rooms. Many offer spectacular views of the lake, and each room has its own unique character and charm. You'll find Crater Lake Lodge offers a setting rich in romance and beauty...a vacation experience you will long treasure.

Cleetwood Cove is the only place where the lake's edge can be accessed. It is reached by means of the moderately steep 1.1 mile Cleetwood trail located 11 miles from Rim Village along Rim Drive. From mid-June to mid-September, weather permitting,

1-3/4 hour boat tours are offered. Tours are conducted on 60-passenger launches with park rangers as interpretive guides.
