

Lakota Narrative about Mato Tipila (Bear Lodge) (also known as Devils Tower)

One day, several Lakota boys were out walking and stumbled upon the body of a dead woman. They were frightened and began running for home. Quickly they found their courage and returned to investigate. They recognized her as Red Cheek Woman, who had married a Star Man from the sky world. To their amazement, they also found a newborn baby alive next to Red Cheek Woman. The boys took the baby back to their village and the people gave him to an old woman to raise. She named him Fallen Star, since he was the child of a Star Man and had fallen to Earth with his Lakota mother.

Fallen Star helped the Lakotas in many ways. However, he was peculiar in that he aged far faster than his Lakota relatives. In just four years, he had become a teenager. Around that time he announced that he wished to leave the Earth and go to his father's land in the sky. But he promised to remember his Lakota relatives, and to help them in two ways. In Lakota that landmark is called Mato Tipila, Lodge of the Bears. There is also a constellation in the sky with the same name. Today the landmark Mato Tipila is called Devils Tower, and the constellation Mato Tipila is called Gemini.
