Plains Indians were unhappy about more settlers and traders moving onto their lands. They took advantage of the Army's reduced forces on the frontier during the Civil War by increasing their attacks on these intruders. After the Civil War, the Army burned an Indian village near Fort Larned as punishment for those attacks.
