

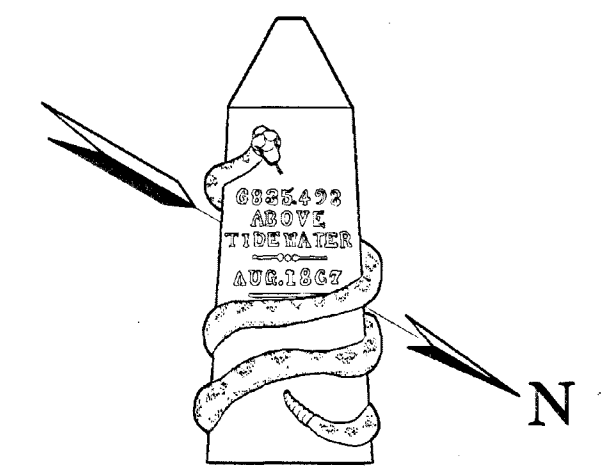
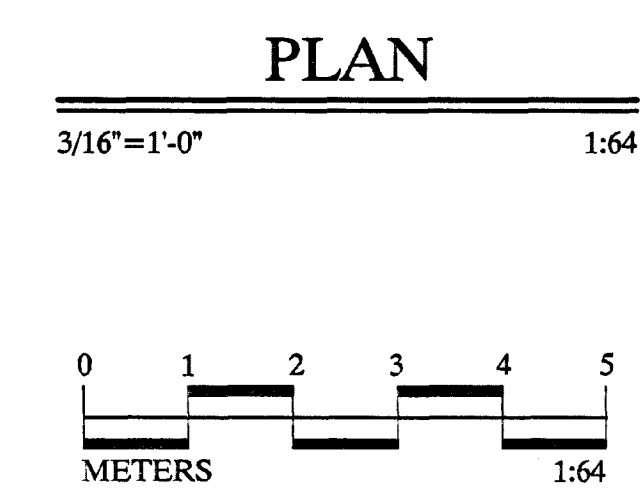
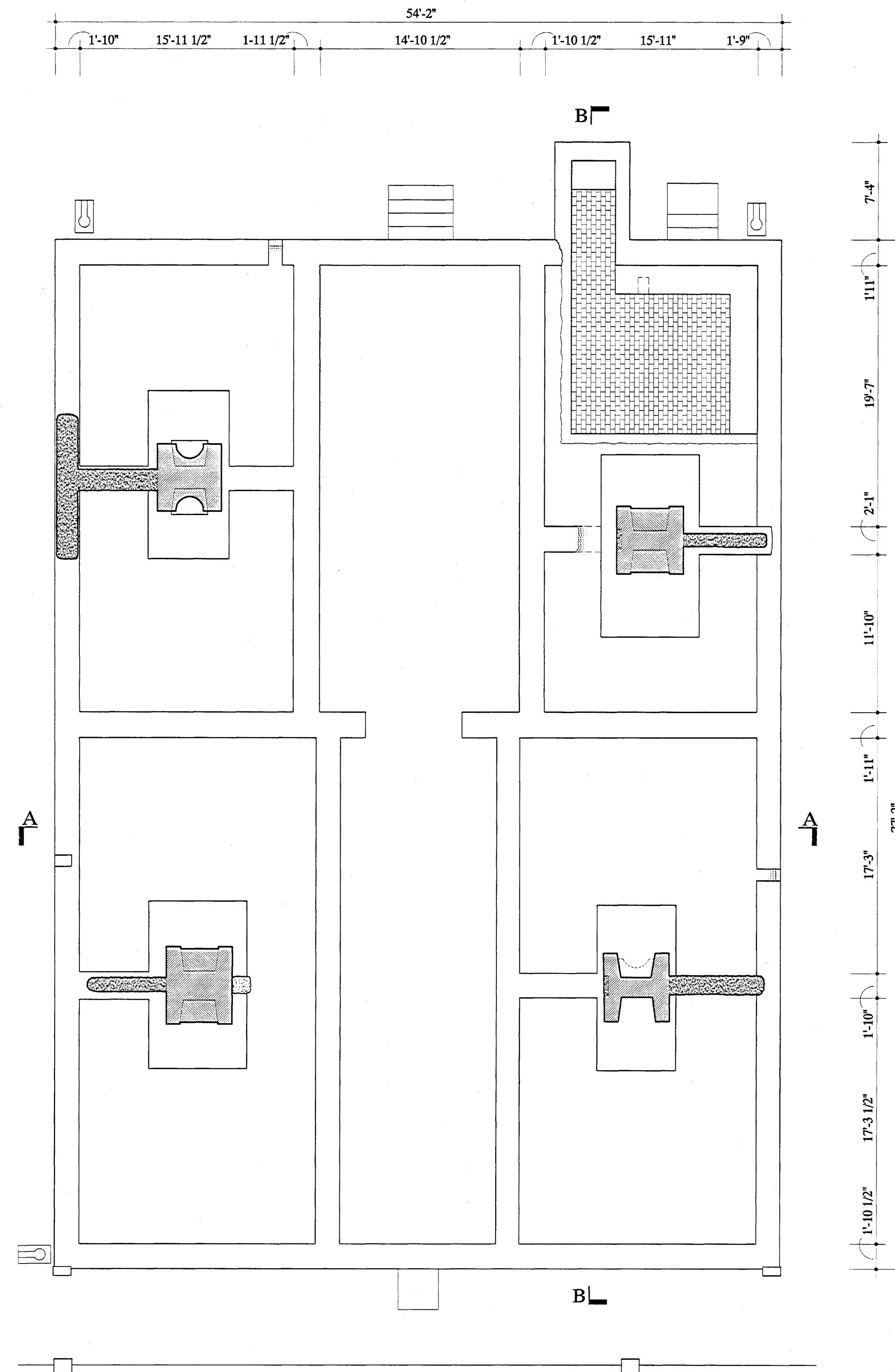
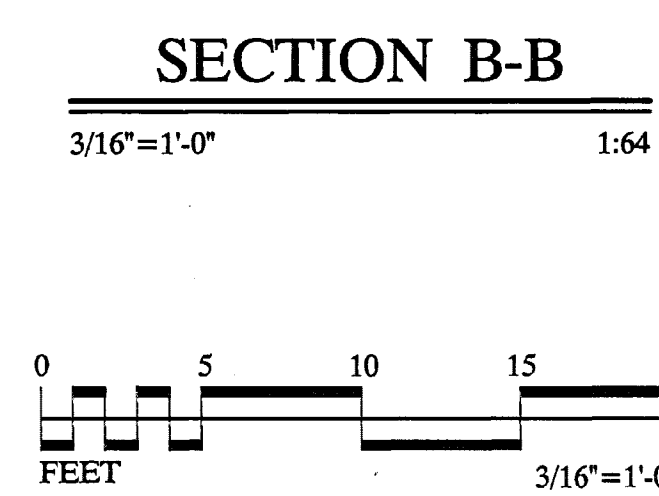
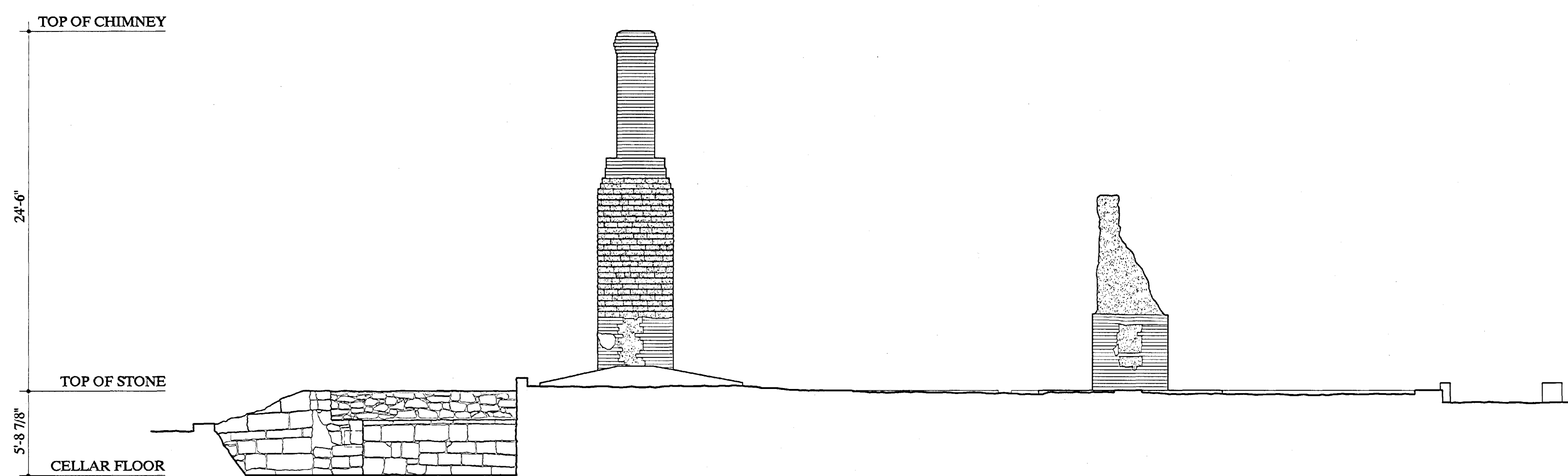
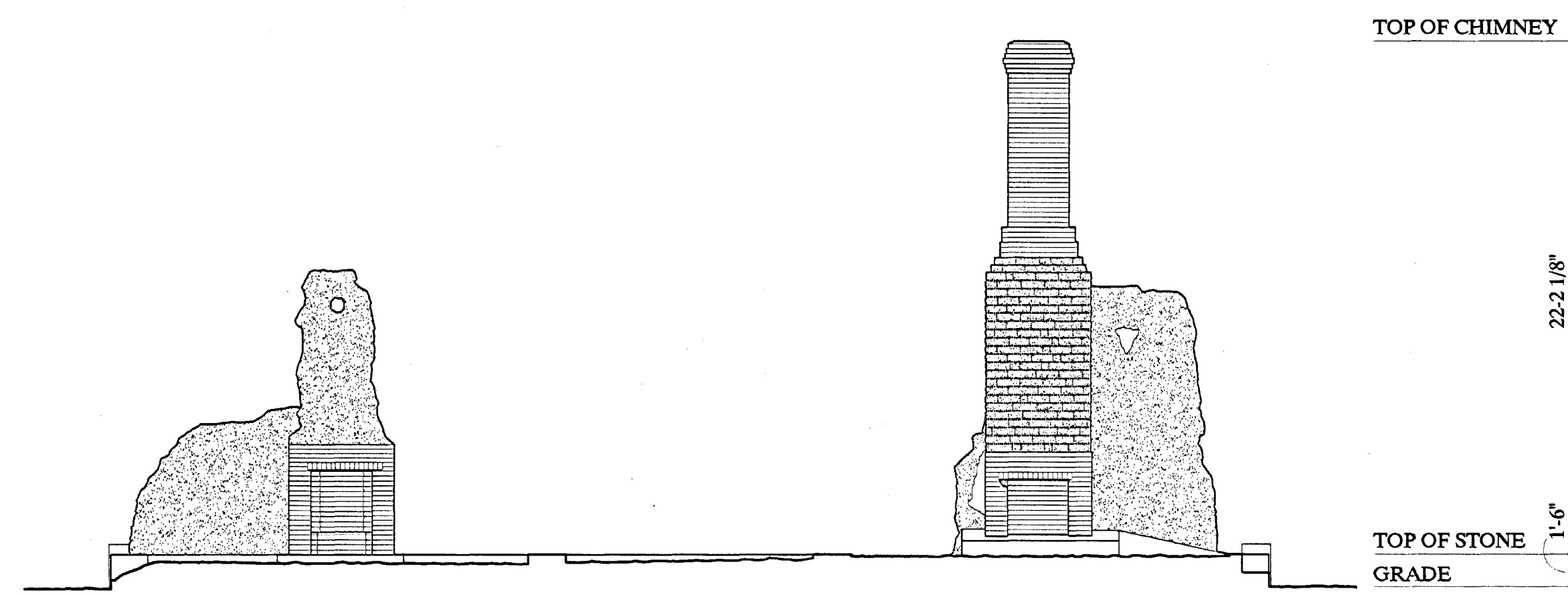
COMMANDING OFFICER'S QUARTERS

BUILDING NO. 5

FORT UNION

THE COMMANDING OFFICER'S QUARTERS FOR THE ARMY POST AT FORT UNION WAS BUILT 1864-67 AS A LARGER VERSION OF THE ADJACENT OFFICERS' QUARTERS. LOCATED IN THE CENTER OF AND IN LINE WITH THE OTHER EIGHT QUARTERS, THE COMMANDING OFFICER'S QUARTERS WAS APPROXIMATELY 22' DEEPER, INCLUDING AN ADDITIONAL ROOM ON EITHER SIDE OF THE CENTER HALL AT THE REAR. UNIQUE AMONG THE NINE QUARTERS, THE BUILDING HAD A STONE-WALLED, BRICK-FLOORED CELLAR BENEATH THE KITCHEN.
