

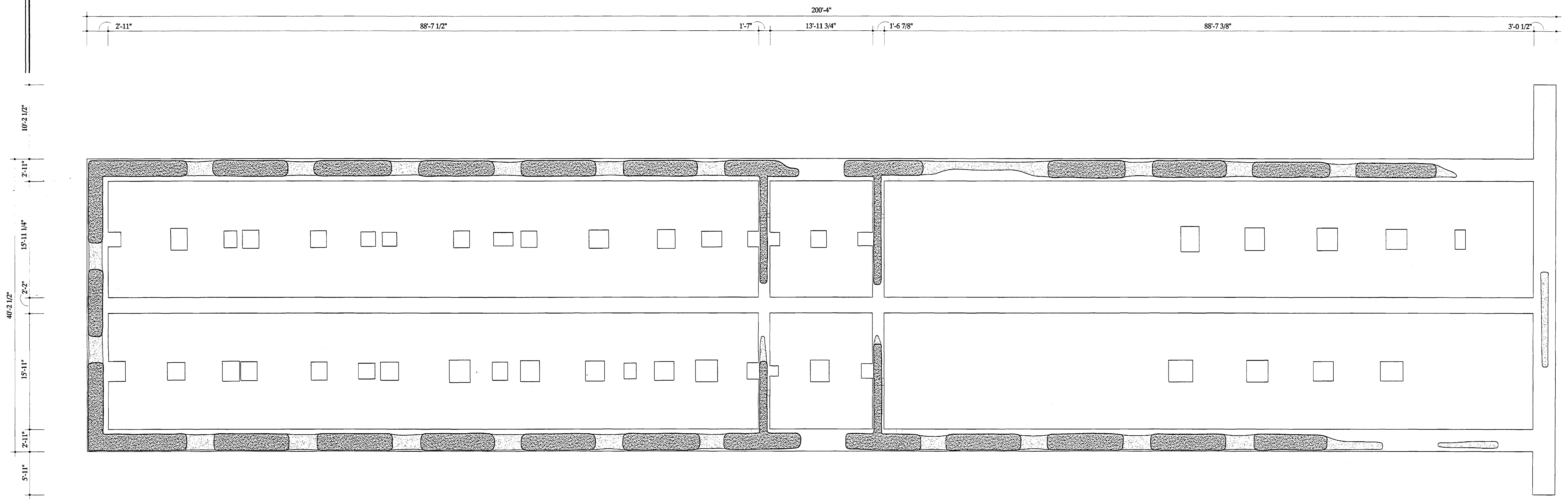

FORT UNION

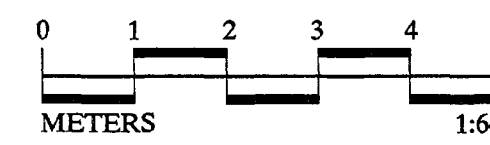
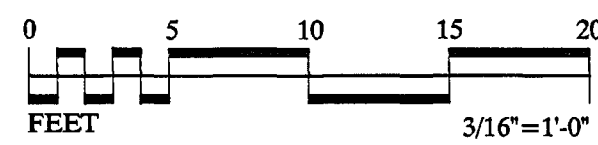
THE QUARTERMASTER STOREHOUSE WAS ONE OF THREE STOREHOUSES OF IDENTICAL SIZE AND LAYOUT, BUILT AT FORT UNION 1866-67. IN PLAN, THE STOREHOUSE CONSISTED OF TWO LONG STORAGE ROOMS SEPARATED BY A CENTER PASSAGE. EXTERIOR LOADING DOCKS ORIGINALLY RAN THE LENGTH OF THE BUILDING ON BOTH SIDES. THE YARDS BETWEEN THE ADJACENT STOREHOUSES WERE ENCLOSED WITH TALL ADOBE WALLS AND WOOD GATES.
