The Wounding of Stonewall Jackson
The Battle of Chancellorsville - May 2, 1863

The most famous soldier to die during the Civil War was General Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson. On May 2, 1863, as the Confederate leader was returning from a nighttime scout between the lines during the Battle of Chancellorsville, he was shot by his own troops who mistook him for a Union horseman. He died eight days later. In 1888, Confederate veterans erected a monument at the spot where Jackson fell.
