

Waterton/Glacier International Peace Park

Montana's Glacier National Park, U.S.A., and Alberta's Waterton Lakes National Park, Canada, meet at the international boundary. In 1932 the two parks were designated the first international peace park to commemorate the bonds of peace and friendship between the two nations.

Although Waterton Lakes and Glacier are administered by separate countries they cooperate to manage their natural and cultural resources.

The park's wild plants and animals ignore political boundaries and claim the mountainous terrain on both sides of the border.

Biosphere Reserves

Glacier and Waterton Lakes National Parks have been designated Biosphere Reserves by the United Nations Education and Scientific Organization's Man and Biosphere Program.

Biosphere Reserves provide for scientific research, education, and the preservation of biologic and genetic diversity. The United Nations program explores the relationships between people and the many ecosystems of the world.

Crown of the Continent Ecosystem

The Crown of the Continent Ecosystem is a natural area extending across the Canada/US border to encompass both Waterton Lakes National Park in Alberta and Glacier National Park in Montana.

The ecosystem straddles the Continental Divide and includes nearby wilderness areas, national forests, Indian reservations and private land.

The boundaries of the Crown of the Continent are not defined by political systems. Instead, they represent an area inhabited by a distinct group of wild plants and animals which share the rugged mountain terrain at the headwaters of three major river systems: Columbia, Hudson Bay and Missouri.

The area is also shared by unique cultural groups including the Blackfeet, Kootenai and Salish Tribes as well as people of international heritage who arrived more recently.

Going-to-the-Sun Road

The Going-to-the Sun Road is a scenic route crossing Glacier National Park from the west entrance near the community of West Glacier to the east entrance near St. Mary.

The 50-mile paved road was completed in the 1930's and was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1983.

The road is narrow, steep and winding. Views from numerous pullouts are outstanding. Travelers should plan to spend 1 1/2 to 3 hours to complete the distance.

Going-to-the-Sun Road Opening & Closing Dates

Weather determines when the Going-to-the-Sun Road opens and closes. Most years it opens in early June and closes in mid-October.

Going-to-the-Sun Road Vehicle Length Restrictions

Vehicle size between Avalanche Campground and Sun Point is restricted:

Glacier's transportation plan calls for a gradual reduction of vehicle size until January, 1994.

1993 - 24' long, 8' wide including mirrors.

1994 - 20' long, 7.5' wide including mirrors.

Inquire at entrance stations and visitor centers for further rules and shoulder season restrictions.

Shuttle Service

Shuttle vans make 12 trips daily from West Glacier & St. Mary. See schedule below. Reservations are recommended. Call (406) 862-2539 for rates and reservations.

Bicycle Riding

Glacier: Bicycle riding is allowed only on established roadways, bike routes or parking areas. Bicycles are restricted on backcountry and nature trails.

Waterton: Mountain bikes are allowed only on specific trails in Waterton.

Going-to-the-Sun Road: Plan to spend 45 minutes riding from Sprague Creek to Logan Creek and three hours from Logan Creek to Logan Pass.

From June 15 through Labor Day, two segments of Going-to-the-Sun Road (Apgar Campground to Sprague Creek Campground and Logan Creek to Logan Pass) are closed to bicycle use between 11 a.m. and 4 p.m. daily due to heavy traffic.

Bicycle camping: A limited number of campsites are held for bicyclists until 7:00 p.m. at Apgar, Sprague Creek, Avalanche, Rising Sun and St. Mary Campgrounds.

Inquire at park entrance stations or information centers for further information, rules and restrictions.

Vehicle Camping

Glacier
Campgrounds are operated on a first come first serve basis. In July and August, arrive in the morning to select a site. Advance reservations are not accepted.

All Glacier Park vehicle campgrounds have drinking water. Most have restrooms with flush toilets and cold running water. The larger campgrounds have trailer disposal stations. None have showers or utility hookups.

Numerous private campgrounds outside Waterton and Glacier offer showers, utility hookups and disposal stations. (See ads, outside.)

Waterton

Belly River, Crandell Mountain and Townsite campgrounds are accessible by paved road for tent and vehicle camping. Each has kitchen shelters, firewood, tables, washrooms and running water.

Only Townsite has sewer, water and electrical connections. Crandell Mountain has a disposal tank. There are no facilities for trailers at Belly River, but sites are large enough for self-contained units.

A camping fee is charged. Limit two weeks.

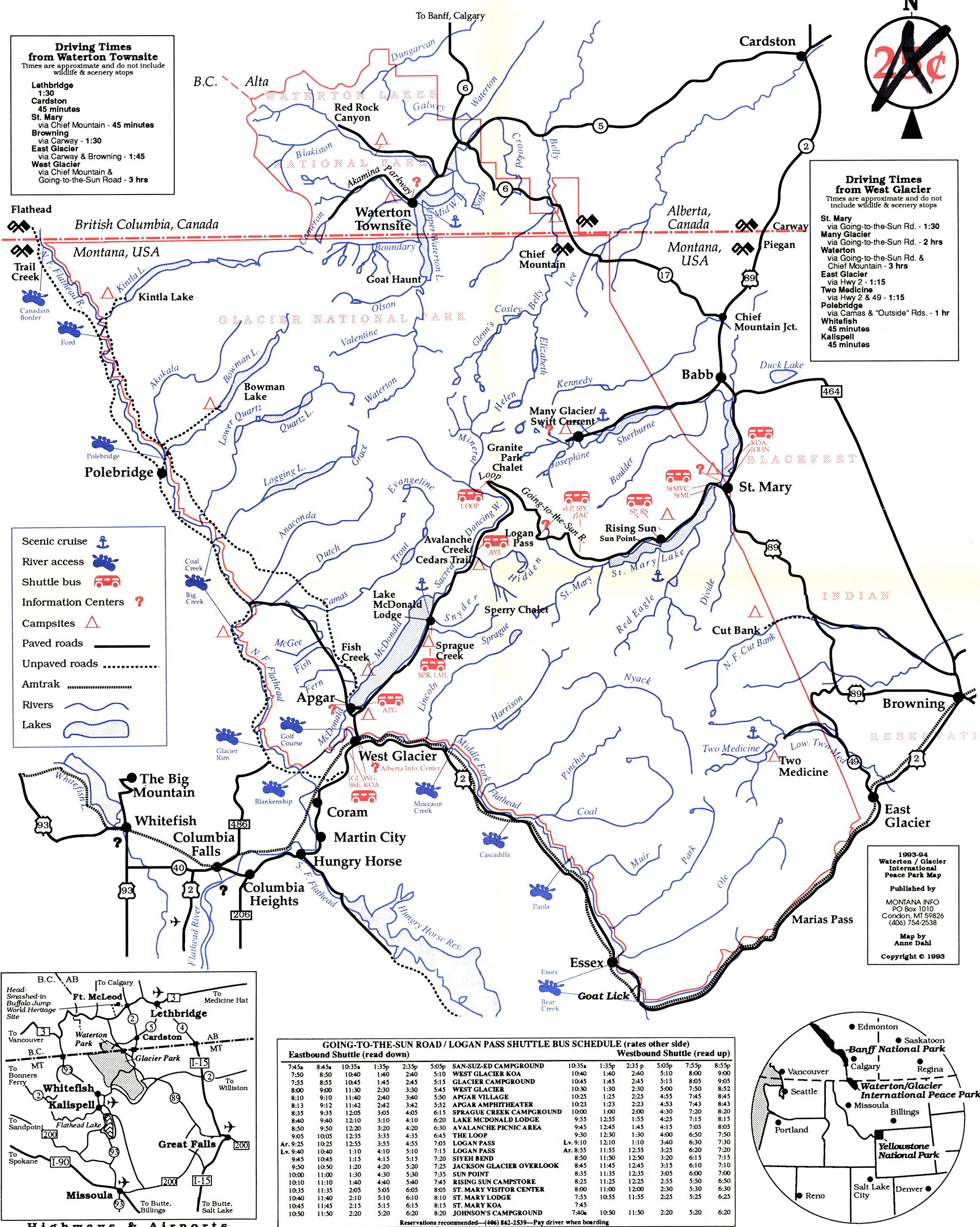
Backcountry Hiking & Camping

Before hiking or camping in the backcountry, read information provided by the Park Service about how to avoid encounters with bears, mountain lions and other large mammals. Follow the rules to protect the lives of wild animals and yourself.

Many of the high passes may not be free of snow until late July.

Trail maps are available at Park information centers.

Hiking & Camping continued

Glacier
Over 95% of Glacier Park is managed as wilderness. Trails are restricted to foot or horseback use.

Permits are required for backcountry overnight use and can be obtained at a visitor's center or ranger station.

Self contained stoves are required in most areas and pets are not allowed on the trails.

A backcountry guide service is available. (See Montana Raft Co./ Glacier Wilderness Guides, other-side.)

Waterton

All backcountry users camping overnight must register with a park warden either at the park information center or at the park administration office in the townsite.

Camping and open fires are permitted in designated areas only.

Horseback Riding

Glacier
Scheduled, guided horseback riding trips are available at Many Glacier, Lake McDonald Lodge and Apgar. If you plan to ride your own horse learn the regulations and restrictions from a free brochure available at park information centers.

Waterton
Guide services and horses for rent are available. Contact the park information center for details, restrictions and regulations if you have your own horses.

Boating and Fishing

Glacier
Boating is permitted on some of Glacier's lakes. Motor size is restricted to 10 hp on most lakes.

Excursion boat tours are offered at Many Glacier, Rising Sun, Two Medicine and Lake McDonald (see Glacier Park Boat Company ad outside).

Fishing regulations are available on request. A Montana fishing license is not required when fishing in Glacier Park.

Waterton
Canoes and row boats are permitted on many of Waterton's ponds and lakes. Motorboats, waterskiing and windsurfing are permitted on Upper and Middle Waterton Lakes.

An excursion boat offers tours on Upper Waterton Lake. Non-motorized boats can be rented at Cameron Lake (See Scenic Tour Boat Cruise, outside).

Fishing licenses are required for all anglers over 16 years old. Licenses and copies of regulations are available at park information centers, from park wardens or at service stations in the townsite.

Wildlife Viewing

Visitors have exceptional opportunities to view a wide variety of wildlife species in natural and semi-natural conditions.

You may see elk, whitetail and "mule" deer, moose, bighorn sheep, mountain goats, grizzly and black bears, cougar (mountain lion), gray wolves, coyotes, pika, marmot, ground squirrels, chipmunks and a

number of other small mammals. A mountain goat viewing site is provided a few miles east of Essex on Hwy. 2.

Ethics: If your actions cause a wild animal to discontinue feeding, leave or otherwise alter its behavior, you are too close. Some animals may appear tolerant but are nevertheless undergoing stress and will flee or charge unexpectedly when you are too near.

Gather information at park information centers before viewing or photographing wildlife.

A fed bear is a dead bear. Please do not feed bears or any other wild animals.

Wild & Scenic Rivers

219 miles of the Flathead River System were designated "Wild and Scenic" by Congress in 1976.

Whitewater raft companies offer half day, full day and extended trips on portions of the Middle and North Forks of the Flathead River. (See Glacier Raft Co., Montana Raft Co., and Wild River Adventures ads, outside.)

Winter Activities

Crosscountry skiing and snowshoeing are popular ways to get around in both parks during winter.

Trail of the Great Bear

The Trail of the Great Bear is a scenic tour linking national parks in Alberta, British Columbia and Montana: Yellowstone—the world's first national park, Banff and Jasper—Canada's first national parks, Waterton/Glacier—the world's first international Peace Park, and Yoho and Kootenay National Parks in British Columbia.

An eco-tourism concept, the Trail of the Great Bear commemorates and perpetuates cultural, wildland and national park values.

The Trail of the Great Bear Travel Information Center and Gift Shop is located in Waterton. (See ad, outside.)
