The Betsy Ross House brings Betsy's business back to life in its newly redesigned shop. The only 18th-century upholstery shop in America is now hands-on and interactive. Meet Betsy, hard at work plying her trade, and have the chance to ask her, not only about how she came to sew the nation's first flag, but all about her business. See real upholsterer's tools and learn first-hand how they were used in this state-of-the-art new exhibit made possible with the support of American Express. Don't miss the current exhibit, *Recovering the Past: The Upholstery Trade in Colonial Philadelphia* running in the gallery.

Language Services

Park maps are available in Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Hebrew, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Polish, Russian and Spanish. There is information in several languages about the Liberty Bell and other park sites. See a Ranger or ask at the Visitor Center if you have a specific request.

Accessibility

Curb cuts are at corners on perimeter sidewalks. All major sites have ramps. Photo albums with pictures of 2nd floor exhibits are available. Audio description of exhibits & AV are at Poe and Kosciuszko Houses, rangers describe exhibits elsewhere. All films are open captioned, with audio description and assisted listening.
