

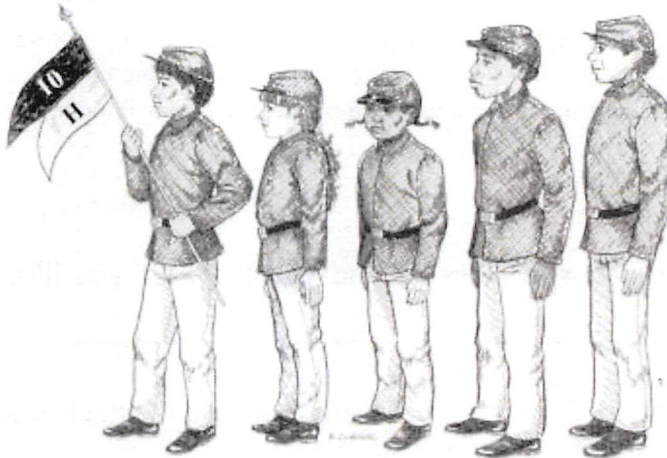

What is Fort Davis National Historic Site?

From 1854 until 1891, soldiers at Fort Davis protected settlers moving West and wagons carrying the U.S. mail & freight on the San Antonio - El Paso Road. Today, the National Park Service preserves Fort Davis as one of the best examples of a frontier military fort.
