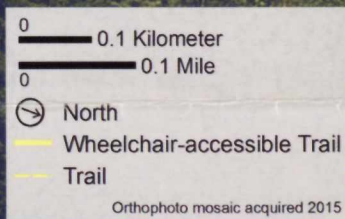
Discover Exit Glacier

Getting There

At mile 3.7 of the Seward Highway, turn onto Herman Leirer Road. Proceed 8.6 miles to the parking lot. There are no fees to access the park. For the safety of your pets and wildlife, please leave your dogs at home.

Exit Glacier Trails

Short trails lead to viewpoints of Exit Glacier. Hike with a park ranger daily at 10am, 2pm, and 4pm, in summer.

Visit The Alaska SeaLife Center

Drive through town and find us at Mile 0 of the Seward Highway, looking out over Resurrection Bay. We are Alaska's only public aquarium and cold water research facility. Fun for all ages, the Alaska SeaLife Center is a great place to explore Alaska's marine ecosystem from beneath the water's surface without getting wet! In addition to general admission, consider enhancing your visit with a Behind-the-Scenes Tour or Animal Encounter.

Explore Beneath the Surface

The Alaska SeaLife Center is described by travelers as "a unique must see." Visit the aviary to see colorful puffins and other seabirds in the deep diving seabird habitat. Learn about urchins, sea stars and other intertidal creatures in the touch tank and don't miss the family friendly Octopus Grotto, home to a giant Pacific octopus.

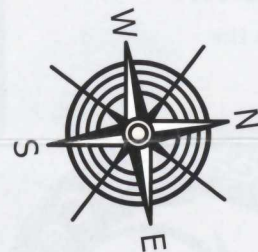
