




Enjoy Two Parks in One Day!

The 6,833-acre Kings Mountain State Park was originally crafted in the 1930's by the Civilian Conservation Corps. The park offers opportunities for outdoor activities such as hiking and equestrian trails, picnicking, fishing, canoe rentals or visit the Living History Farm to experience early pioneer life.

Adjacent to the State Park, and considered a turning point in the American Revolution, **Kings Mountain National Military Park** commemorates the first major patriot victory of the Southern Campaign. Explore the preserved battlefield, a movie produced by The History Channel, hiking trails, and a museum of period artifacts and information.

Ranger for a Day

HISTORY OF THE PARK

The Battle of Kings Mountain was one of the few major battles during the American Revolution that was fought entirely by Americans with the exception of British Major Patrick Ferguson. There were no Continental soldiers or British Regulars present, all troops were militia with the exception of the Loyalist Provincials from the New York and New Jersey area. Kings Mountain was one of the only battles where the American Long Rifle was the predominant weapon used by the patriot militia. It's accuracy greatly aided the patriots in the rout over the loyalist militia who suffered 225 casualties, including British Major Patrick Ferguson.
