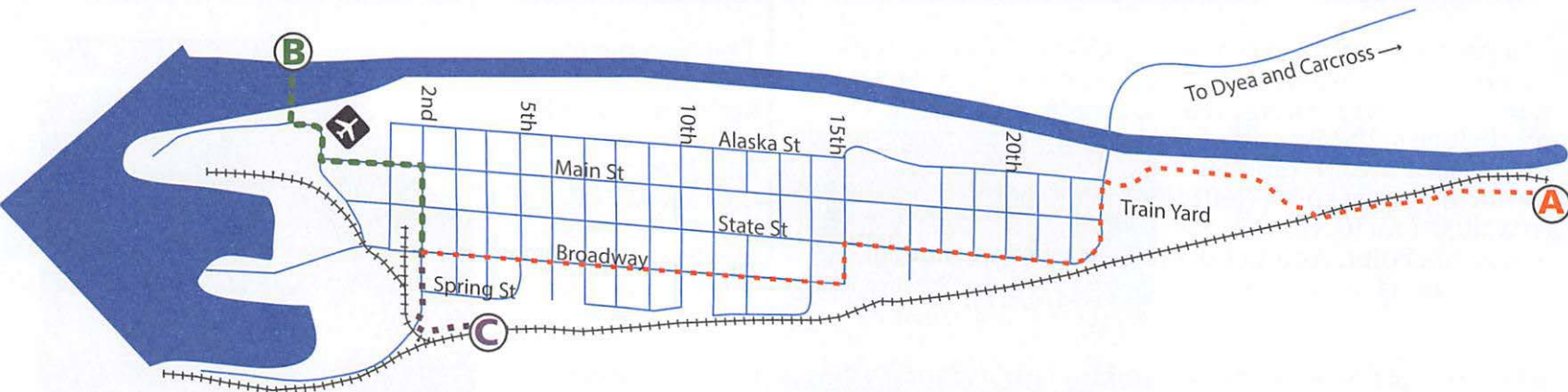




Hikes and Short Walks in and Around Skagway

This guide is produced by the National Park Service (NPS). The trails included here are maintained by the Municipality of Skagway and are not NPS property or trails.



Directions to the Trailheads

* All distances and times are roundtrip from trailhead unless indicated otherwise.

A. Gold Rush Cemetery and Lower Reid Falls

•Time: 1.5-2 hours •Distance: 3.6 mi (5.8 km) round trip •Rating: Easy •Elevation Gain: 50ft (15m)

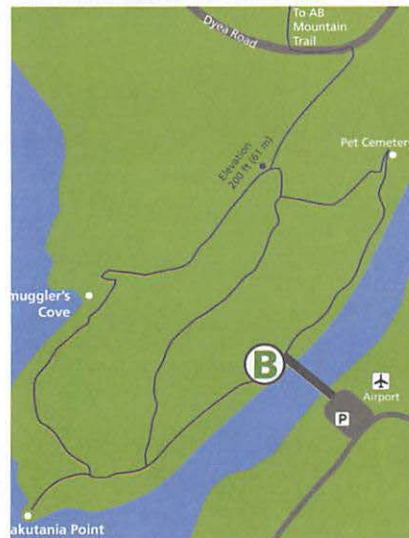
Wander through Skagway's original cemetery. The cemetery is 1.8 miles (2.9 km) from the NPS visitor center. Notable Skagway figures like Jeff. "Soapy" Smith, Frank Reid, and Martin Itjen are buried here. A short walk about a hundred yards past the cemetery leads to Lower Reid Falls. The cemetery is maintained by the Municipality of Skagway and is not National Park Service property.



B. Yakutania Point and Smuggler's Cove Trails

- Time: 1.5-2 hours
- Distance: up to 2 mi (3.2 km)
- Rating: Moderate
- Elevation Gain: 200ft (61m)

This trail begins about 0.5 miles (0.8 km) from the NPS Visitor Center. Walk to Main St. and turn south. Follow it to the airport parking area. The trailhead is the footbridge at the far end of the parking area. From the footbridge, turn south (left) to walk 0.5 mi (0.8 km) to Yakutania Point. Another 0.5 mi (0.8km) takes you to Smuggler's Cove. Turn north (right), from the footbridge, and walk 0.25 mi (0.4 km) to reach the Pet Cemetery. Connecting trails can be used to create a loop. Some trails gain over 200 ft (61 m) in elevation.



The AB Mountain Trailhead can be accessed from this trail. Take the hiking trail up to the Dyea Road and turn left. Walk 0.1 mi (0.16 km) to the AB trailhead. This trail is a rigorous all day hike. Please ask for more information before attempting.

C. Dewey Lake Trail System

- Time: 1 hour
- Distance: 1 mi (1.6 km)
- Rating: Moderate
- Elevation Gain: 500ft (152m)

This trail begins 0.25 miles (0.4 km) from the NPS visitor center. Take 2nd Ave toward the railroad tracks. Before the tracks, turn north (left) at the "Dewey Lake Trails" sign. Follow the trail between the creek and the railroad tracks to the trailhead.



From the trailhead, hike uphill to Lower Dewey Lake. The first 0.5 mi (0.8 km) is uphill 500 ft (152 m) to the reservoir. From here a short walk takes you to Lower Dewey Lake. Around the lake are several viewpoints and picnic areas.
