How We Spent 2018

By the Numbers

National Heritage Areas expand on traditional conservation approaches by supporting large-scale, community-driven initiatives that engage communities in heritage preservation activities. National Heritage Area entities collaborate with stakeholders to determine how to make heritage relevant to local needs and interests. These entities serve as catalysts for community and economic development. In 2018, NHAs:

- Leveraged **\$62.1 million** in cash and in-kind support to carry out heritage projects and program, greatly increasing the impact of the **\$19.3 million** in federal Heritage Partnership Program funding received.
- Engaged **2,508 formal partners** and **5,312 informal partners** in heritage area activities.
- Benefited from **35,360 volunteers** contributing over **741,640 hours** for heritage area projects – a **\$18.8 million** dollar value.

Preserving our Heritage. Across the country, National Heritage Areas and their partners are reviving historic downtowns, preserving battlefields and industrial sites, and sharing our nation's history through the arts. In 2018:

- **51 historic sites** and **11,417 acres of cultural landscapes** preserved and maintained, including battlefields.
- **90 community development projects** were carried-out, including streetscape improvement and art projects.
- **67 collections projects** undertaken, including the conservation of artifacts and creation of oral histories.
- **97 historic preservation grants** awarded totaling **\$1.3 million**.

Healthy Environment & People. Conservation activities led by National Heritage Area entities and their partners improve air and water quality and support healthy ecosystems. In 2018:

- **8494 acres of land restored and maintained** via invasive species removal, replanting and toxic site clean-ups.
- **50 conservation grants** awarded totaling **\$703,287**.

Through recreational projects such as land and water trails, National Heritage Areas are improving connectivity and accessibility, creating more vibrant and healthy communities. In 2018:

- **116 recreation projects** undertaken.
- **1270 miles of trails** maintained and **70 new miles of trails** developed.
- **71 recreation grants** awarded totaling **\$586,748**.

Educating Current and Future Leaders. Through programs such as Cane River National Heritage Area's *City of Natchitoches Art Adventures Camp*. National Heritage Areas and their partners are providing meaningful and inspirational connections to our nation's heritage and exploring the qualities and skills of leadership. In 2018:

- Capacity-building assistance provided to **1,413** organizations.
- **180 educational programs** were offered.
- **421 grants** to support educational programs were awarded totaling **\$1.7 million**.
