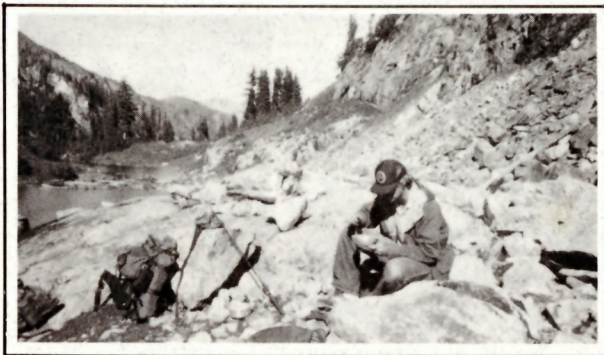
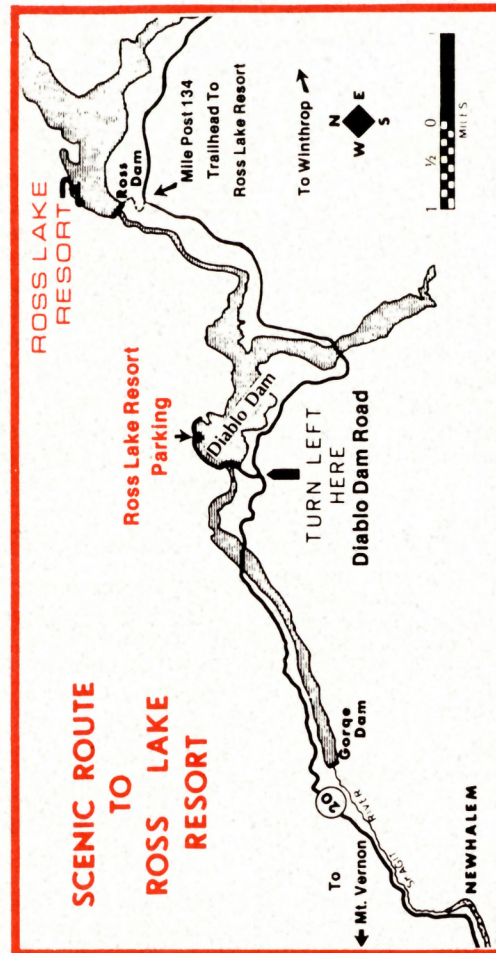

TO REACH ROSS LAKE RESORT

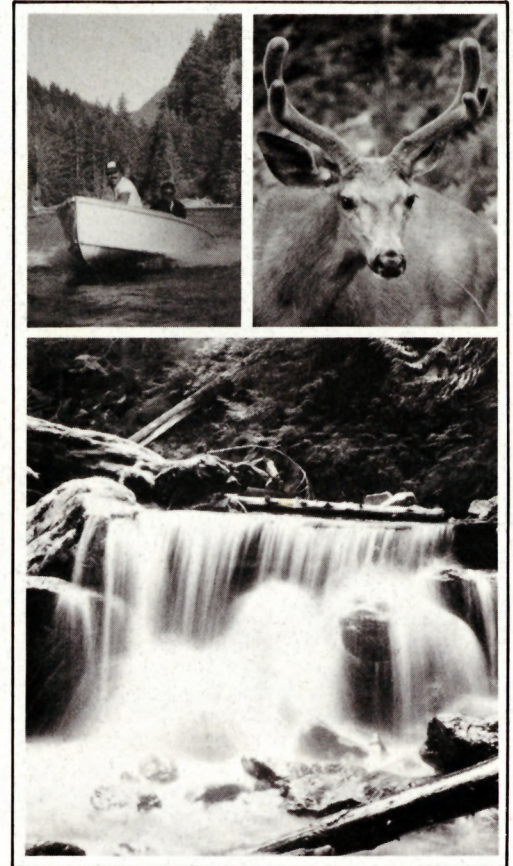
Turn off I-5 at Burlington and drive east on HWY 20, 65 miles to Diablo Dam (or from Winthrop, drive west on HWY 20, 68 miles). Cross Diablo Dam, turn right and park nearby at the Ross Lake Resort parking lot. Board the tugboat which departs at 8:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. daily, and takes you to the end of Diablo Lake. You'll be met by our truck there to take you from Diablo Lake to Ross Lake (around the Ross Dam). Alternatively, you may hike two miles to Ross Lake Resort from mile post 134 on HWY 20.



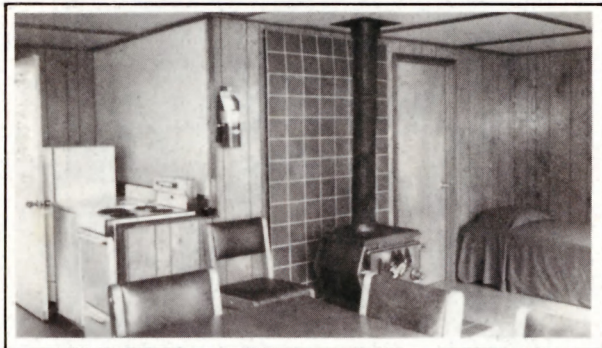
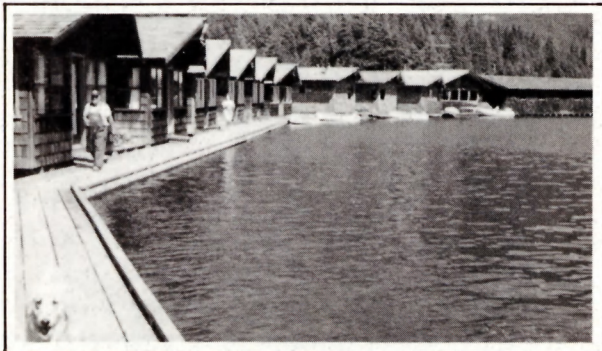

ROSS LAKE RESORT



**A Secluded Floating Resort
in the North Cascades**



ROSS LAKE RESORT, in existence since 1950, is situated in a line of ten individual cabins and three bunkhouses built on log floats. It is located on the west side of Ross Lake, just north of Ross Dam. It is the *ONLY* facility on the lake and is characterized by its remoteness (no direct road access). Nevertheless, the resort is easily accessible—just a three hour drive from Seattle to meet the tugboat and truck that deliver you to Ross Lake less than an hour later.

ROSS LAKE was created by the damming of the Skagit River and is in the recreation area of the North Cascades National Park. The elevation of the lake is 1600 feet and it is over 20 miles long. The climate is similar to Seattle's.

ACCOMMODATIONS

All of our cabins are completely furnished and include electricity and hot and cold running water. Towels, bedding, tableware, pots and pans are provided. There are three styles of cabins to choose from —

Modern Cabin:

Large picture windows framing Colonial and Pyramid Peaks. Spacious dining-living room combined. Woodstove or electric heat. Complete kitchen with electric range. Private bathroom. Twin and bunk beds. Accommodates one to five.

Little Cabin:

Smaller and a bit more rustic than the modern cabin (shared bathroom with one other cabin). Newly constructed with small kitchen—electric stove-top (no oven), small refrigerator. Woodstove. Bunk beds. Accommodates one to four.

Private Bunkhouse:

For parties of six or more. Large combined kitchen-dining-sleeping area. Woodstove, electric stove-top (no oven), full size refrigerator. Private bathroom. Bunk beds. Accommodates six to ten.

RECREATION

ROSS LAKE offers the following recreational activities:

Fishing, Hiking, Backpacking, Tent Camping, Kayaking, Canoeing. These activities are especially appealing here because of our relative seclusion. One of the most popular things to do is fishing for our native "Red" Rainbow (also an occasional Cutthroat and Eastern Brook trout). Because they are wild, these trout are fun to catch and particularly delicious! Trolling with "pop gear" and a favorite lure or fly are the recommended method of fishing.

The Ross Lake area offers some of the most beautiful hiking trails in the North Cascades (Sourdough Mountain, Devils Loop, Desolation Peak, Beaver Loop). Tent camping is outstanding - there are many campgrounds around the lake with tent-sites, picnic tables, cooking grills, and outhouses at each one. All trails and campgrounds are well maintained and regulated by the National Park Service.

Finally... This large, beautiful lake (and its Falls and Creeks) can only be appreciated fully by boat, kayak, or canoe.

RESORT SERVICES

- Full Marina including rental of 50 14-foot boats with 9.9 hp motors, 8 canoes and 6 Kyaks to resort guests and campers.
- Canoe and small boat portage from Diablo Lake.
- Water taxi for backpackers and hikers to trailheads.

WHAT TO BRING

Bring your own food—there is no restaurant or store here. Also, we suggest you bring outdoor clothing & footwear suitable for the season (Summer temperatures may reach 90°, Fall temperatures from 50° to 75°); and rain gear—just in case. Bring your camera and sunglasses. And, don't forget your fishing rod and reel (medium action, 8-12 lb. line)!
