



### **Explore the Trail**

The North Country National Scenic Trail is a premier footpath stretching 4,600 miles across eight northern states. One of just eleven National Scenic Trails, it will be the longest offroad hiking trail in the United States. In Wisconsin, the trail crosses Iron, Ashland, Bayfield, and Douglas Counties. It passes through the Penokee Range, Copper Falls State Park, Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest, Bayfield County Forest, Brule River State Forest, Douglas County Forest, and Pattison State Park.


