In 1895 Saunders, a Collector of Customs, bought this location and erected the "far-famed" Log Cabin Hotel. It was a handsomely constructed two-story building of peeled cedar logs. The hotel fell victim to fire in 1932. A watercolor painting of the Log Cabin Hotel now hangs in our lobby.

The present Log Cabin Lodge was built by Carl Hansen; the facilities have expanded over the years into a resort now including cabins, motel rooms, A-frame chalets, camping log cabins, R.V. and store, restaurant and bar, gift shop, marina and boat rental.

In 1938, under Roosevelt's administration, Congress set aside this area as a National Park; the Park now covers just under one million acres of which Log Cabin Resort occupies 17 acres.

In June of 1982 the Olympic National Park was added to the list of World Heritage Parks.

We hope your visit to the Olympic National Park and your stay at Lake Crescent Log Cabin Resort will be a memorable one.

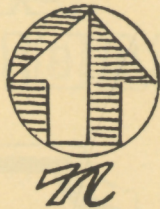

VISITOR ACTIVITIES

Hoh Rain Forest: a forest oddity in Western Washington.

Hurricane Ridge: a look at the snow capped mountains and deep valleys.

Kalaloch: Pacific Ocean strip with tidepools, beachcombing, and clamming.

Lyre River: offers winter and summer run steelhead fishing only 4 miles away.

Marymere Falls: a popular 3/4 mile stroll to the falls.

Neah Bay: home of the Makah Reservation and Museum.

Olympic Game Farm: walking and driving tours.

O.N.P. Pioneer Memorial Museum: visitors center.

Port Angeles: Pier and Marine Lab., salmon fishing/charters, spit, golf, bowling, public indoor pool, roller skating and shops.

Rialto Beach: Pacific Ocean strip of beachcombing.

Salt Creek Beach/Park: on the Strait of Juan de Fuca.

Sol Duc Hot Springs: hot mineral pools.

Sol Duc River: Offers winter and summer run steelhead fishing, 20 miles away.

Spruce Railroad Trail: a 4-mile walking trail to Fairholm.

Storm King: a 3-mile hiking trail rising to a 4500' elevation.

Victoria: a 1-1/2 hour ferry ride to British Columbia.
