
About Birding at Organ Pipe

Organ Pipe Cactus National Monument serves as home to a diverse bird community characteristic of the Sonoran desert. A total of 277 bird species have been seen in the Monument, although many of these are seen only occasionally or at particular times of the year. Quitobaquito springs and pond in the southwest corner of the Monument is a favorite spot for birding, in fact one of the best-known sites for observing birds in this corner of Arizona.
