

By 1893, Pullman was home to nearly 12,000 residents- people who came from all corners of the world, all striving for the opportunity to share in the American dream. These family stories are our Pullman stories.

Pullman House Project tours will start at the recently renovated home of Pullman's General Manager, H.H. Sessions, now the **Pullman House Project Welcome Center** (605 East 111th Street, Chicago) including exhibits, visitor orientation and also the **Pullman Club Coffee Shop.** 

Our interpretors will escort visitors on the only Pullman tour to see the interior of houses which have been recreated to evoke the period in the 1880's when the Jordan and the Dunbar families made Pullman their home. These families are among the migrant and immigrant families which helped to shape Pullman and the America we know today.
