

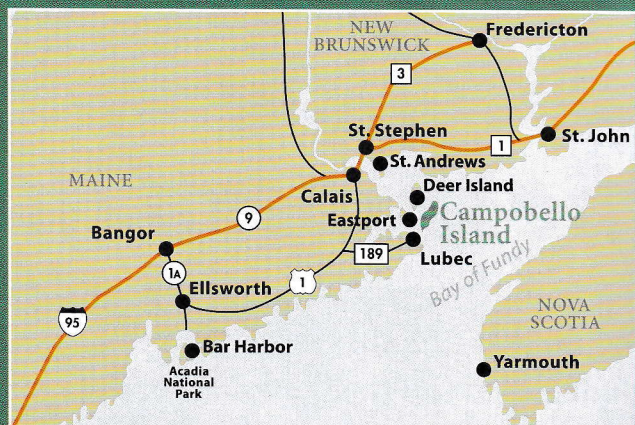

- Last tour at 4:45 pm EDT; 5:45 pm ADT

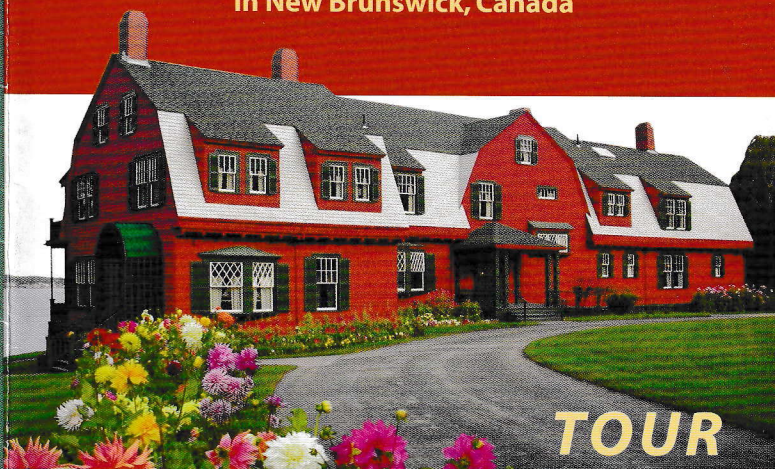
Visitor Centre and Adventure Centre OPEN Daily

Park's Natural Area OPEN Daily year-round.

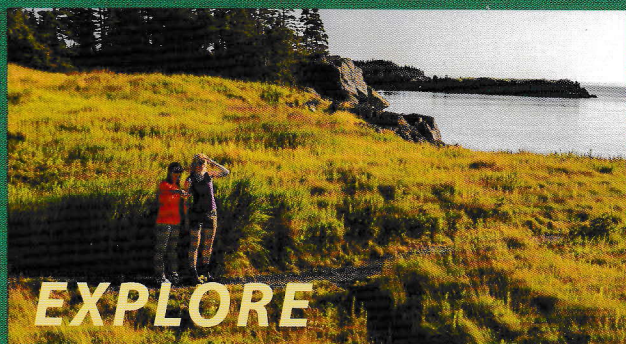


Roosevelt Campobello International Park in New Brunswick, Canada



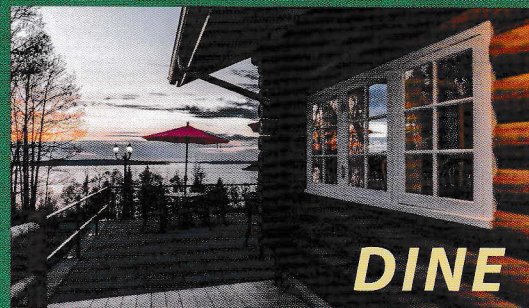

Lunch and dinner daily overlooking Friar's Bay.

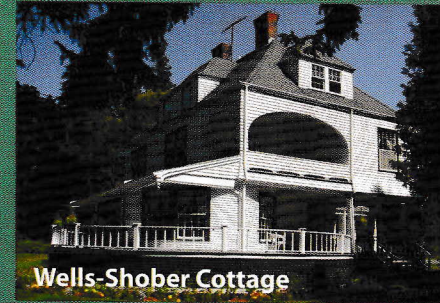

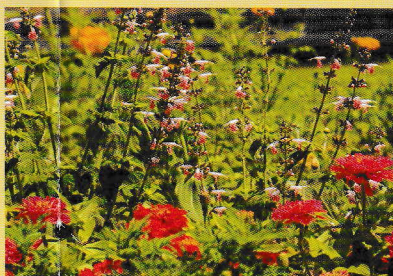
Tour FDR's magnificent cottage filled with family mementos.

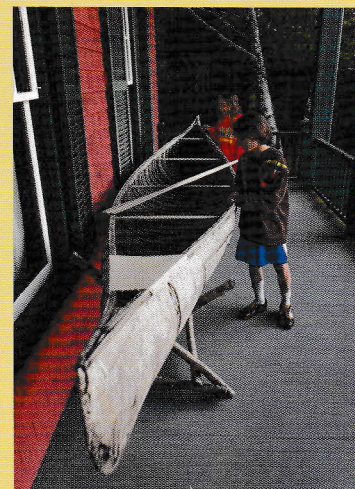

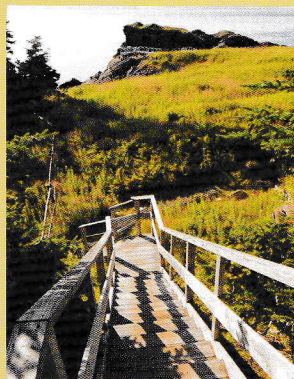
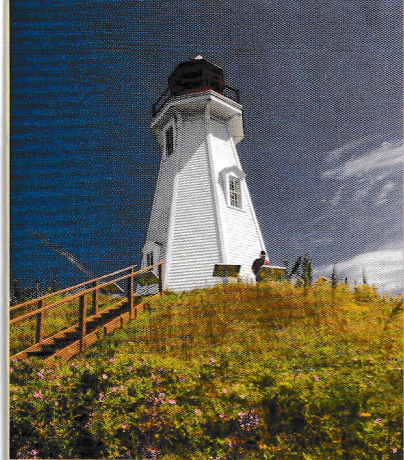


Explore the Visitor Centre with an introductory film and exhibits about the Roosevelts and the close U.S.-Canadian relationship.

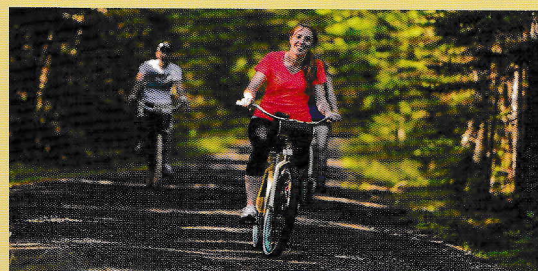


Take a guided tour of the grounds and learn how the Roosevelts spent their summers on the island.
