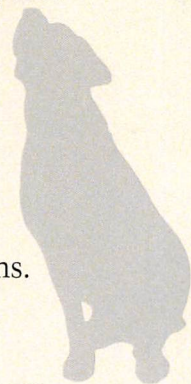




Be a B.A.R.K. Ranger

To become a Bark Ranger, your human must follow the basic B.A.R.K principles. B.A.R.K. stands for:



Bag your pet's waste

Help keep the park clean by collecting and disposing of dog waste in outdoor trashcans.

Always leash your pet

Pets must be on a leash no longer than 6 feet.

Respect wildlife

It is important that you keep your dog at a respectful distance from any animals you may encounter, including other dogs.

Know where you can go

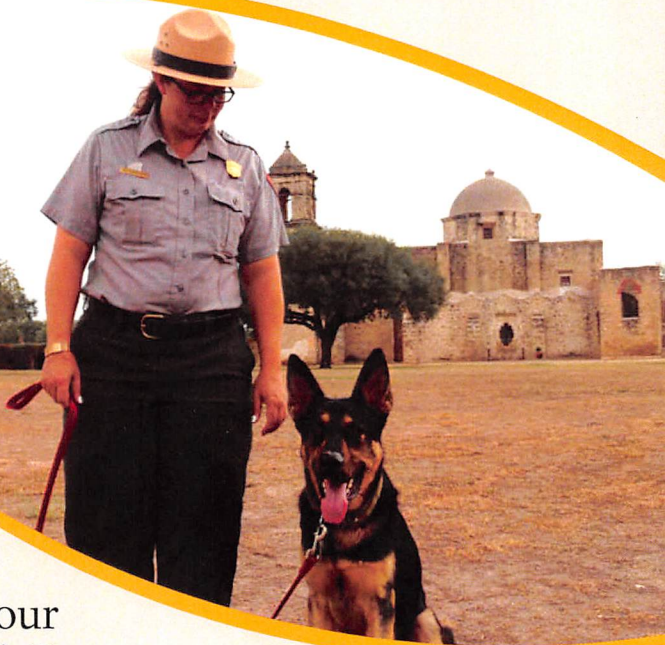
Pets are not allowed inside mission churches or the visitor center. Never leave pets alone in a car. Beware of heat.



Service dogs are legally permitted anywhere that visitors can go. Dogs classified as service animals are individually trained to perform a specific task that assists a person with a disability.
