Augustus Saint-Gaudens Sculptor

Discover the home, studios, and gardens of the great American sculptor, Augustus Saint-Gaudens (1848-1907).



Over 100 examples of the artist's work on display include bas-relief portraits, casts of his renowned public monuments, and his designs for the 1907 \$20 dollar gold piece, considered America's most beautiful coin. The premier sculptor of the "Gilded Age," his works continue to inspire world-wide interest.

Visit the sculptor-in-residence, relax to the sounds of the summer Sunday concerts, and find inspiration in the same landscape and ambience that drew Saint-Gaudens to Cornish. Guided tours, changing art exhibitions, sculpting workshops, and nature trails are among the offerings.

Directions:

Saint-Gaudens National Historic Site is located just off NH 12A in Cornish, NH, 12 miles south of West Lebanon, NH. From I89 use exit 20, then south on NH 12A. From I91 use exit 8 (Ascutney) then east to NH 12A north. From Windsor, VT cross the covered bridge to NH then left onto Rt 12A north.



Hours and Fees:

The site is open daily from late May through late October. Buildings are open 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. An admission fee is charged for persons over 15 years of age. For special event information contact the park.
