Highlights

Steamtown National Historic Site includes a Visitor Center, Theater, History Museum, a working Roundhouse, Technology Museum, and many pieces of railroading and industrial equipment. Ranger-led programs and tours are available throughout the year as well as behind-the-scenes tours of the Locomotive Shop where trains are repaired and restored.

Trains

Short train rides on vintage steam and diesel equipment through the historic railyard and longer sightseeing excursions to a variety of destinations happen on weekends. Destinations include: Cresco, Tobyhanna, Gouldsboro, East Stroudsburg, Delaware Water Gap, Carbondale, Archbald and Moscow, PA. (April through November, check website for schedule and pricing.)
