


All tracks in the Steamtown Yard are active tracks and both passenger and freight trains operate on them on a daily basis. Use extreme caution around any tracks on park grounds. Do not climb on any railroad displays. In addition, coal burning locomotives produce cinders which can soil clothing and/or cause eye irritation. Visitors should avoid all areas where steam from the locomotives might reach them.

The Park

Steamtown National Historic Site, located in Scranton, Pennsylvania, was established on October 30, 1986 to further public understanding and appreciation of the role steam railroading played in the development of the United States. It is the only place in the National Park System where the story of steam railroading and the people who made it possible is told.



Steamtown Highlights

Train Excursions

Seasonal 26 mile round-trip excursions from the park to Moscow. PA

Ranger Guided Tours and Train Operations Demonstrations

Tour the restoration and locomotive maintenance shops and learn first-hand about the work that goes into restoring and maintaining vintage locomotives and rolling stock.

Technology and History Museums

Exhibits, films and displays present an in-depth look at railroad history including the people responsible for the operation of steam-powered locomotives in the United States.

Restored Roundhouse and Turntable

During the live steam season, visitors can watch the roundhouse and train crew prepare the steam engines for operation each morning. Locomotives weighing in excess of 200 tons are positioned for their daily activities utilizing the restored turntable.

Seasonal Tours of the Lackawanna Station

Opened in 1908, the Lackawanna Station served as a passenger depot and offices for the DL&W Railroad during the peak years of the anthracite age.

Transported by train, rangers give tours of the French Rennaisance style station and mosaics in the building's lobby. This restored historic structure is now a hotel.

Visiting Locomotives and Railroad Equipment

At various times during the year, visiting locomotives and rolling stock can be found on site. Some pieces are here only for restoration while others are open for viewing on special event days. Ranger-led shop tours give visitors a close up look at this equipment when it is available.

Special Events

Exciting events that interpret the unique connection railroads have with other aspects of America's past and present are held at various times throughout the year. Night photo shoots, special film presentations, model railroad displays, talks, exhibits and demonstrations highlight many of the events.


