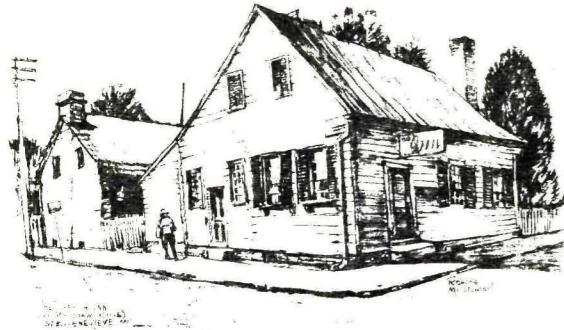

- BOLDUC-LEMEILLEUR HOUSE, built about 1820. Open to the Public.



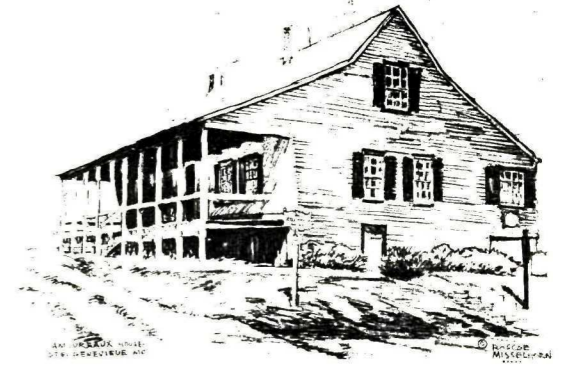
BOLDUC HOUSE, built around 1770, moved to present site around 1784, is now regarded as the most authentically restored Creole House in the nation. Accurately restored and furnished with stockade fence, frontier kitchen and living quarters, 18th century garden. Open to public, April 1 - November 1. Admission charge.



MAMMY SHAW HOUSE - FUR TRADING POST are adjacent structures built about 1790. Frame house contains unusual fixtures and doors from early steamboat. Stone trading post with presumed slave quarters contains museum displays. Open to public. Admission charge.



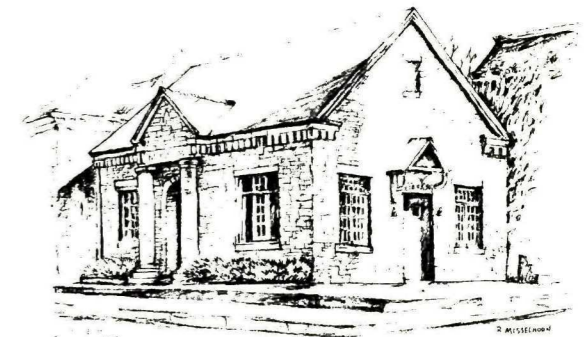
GREEN TREE TAVERN built around turn of 18th century by Francois Janis, friend of George Rogers Clark, was used as tavern and inn following Louisiana Purchase. Unusual triangular fireplace opens into three rooms. Roof supported by 150 stripped walnut saplings. Open to public. Adm. charge.



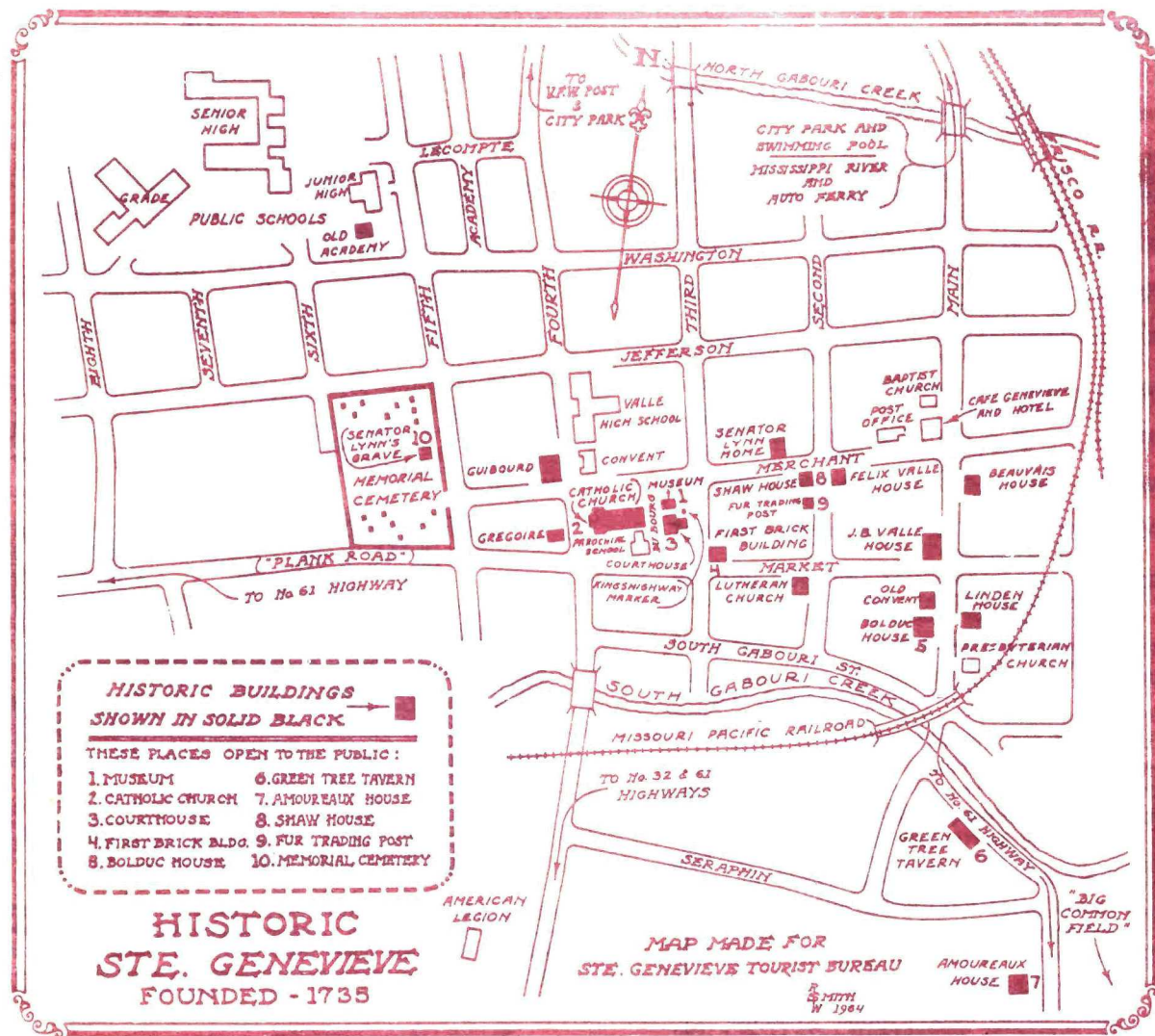
AMOUREAUX HOUSE, built 1770, home of French nobleman, Mathurin Michel Amoureux, correspondent of Thomas Jefferson. Antique doll and toy collection on display. North gallery is a "YesterYear Antique Shop". To the rear is Country Store-gifts and souvenirs. Open daily. Admission charge.



ST. GEMME-BEAUVAIS HOUSE, built 1770, by St. Gemme family. Made famous by Henry Marie Brackenridge, noted Historian who was guest there in 1790's. Beautiful service of Limoges China on display. Open daily. Adm. charge.



MUSEUM contains varied collections of local memorabilia. Items of interest include: birds mounted by Jean Jacques Audubon; bank safe allegedly robbed by Jesse James; Indian relics; old documents and Spanish land grants. Open daily. Admission charge.
