How to Read the Bird Sightings List

R – **REGULARLY SEEN SPECIES THROUGHOUT THE YEAR**. Some are permanent breeding residents (such as a Pileated Woodpecker). Others can be seen here year round, but are non-breeding, or temporary residents (such as Brown Pelican), and their numbers fluctuate depending on the time of year. Others are common, but heard much more than seen (such as Clapper Rail). Many permanent species are much easier to find during the breeding season (such as Yellow-throated Warbler) and some are nocturnal (such as Black-crowned Night-Heron or Great Horned Owl).

S – **SPORADIC SPECIES** that are the same as those marked with R, EXCEPT they are more sporadic and therefore could be harder to find or even missed (such as Blue-gray Gnatcatcher or Double-crested Cormorant).

SPECIES WITH DATES – The dates represent single sightings and/or the first and last sighting dates of the season or year.

SPECIES IN BOLD – These are species that have been sighted prior to the current year. The birds listed at the bottom of the page were seen before 2006. Have you seen one of these birds – something different?

BIRDS IN ITALICS – These are birds that are either accidental or rare. They are italicized and the date(s) of observation(s) is given.

Please report sightings to the rangers and don't forget to ask for a checklist of birds!

After the bird list, there are lists for butterflies, moths, dragonflies, and damselflies.
