Touro Synagogue is the oldest synagogue in the United States. Designed by Peter Harrison and dedicated in 1763, Touro is considered to be one of the most architecturally distinguished buildings of 18th century America.

In a letter "To The Hebrew Congregation in Newport," written in 1790, President George Washington eloquently defined the new nation's standard for religious freedom and civil liberties. He declared that America... "gives to bigotry no sanction, to persecution no assistance."
