Children's Hike: A good oppertunity for children to learn about life on a small island. For a fun filled two hours, the hikers will explore the Cinnamon Bay area.

<u>Cinnamon Bay Hike</u>: A ranger guided one mile hike along a loop trail into the moist Cinnamon Bay forest. Observesome of the largest fruit trees on St. John. The trail climbs slightly up the valley along a "gut". The bay rum grove and sugar cane terraces are good reminders of a past commercial period.

Reef Bay Hike: This moderate three mile downhill trail begins in a moist sub-tropical forest and travels through various vegetation zones to the southshore cactus woodland. Lunch by the mysterious petroglyphs reflecting in a quiet pool. explore an old steam sugar mill ruins. Bring along a lunch and beverage. Wear good hiking shoes. Reservations are reguired (776-6201). Bus transportation is available from Cinnamon Bay Camp, departing at 9;30 AM (\$2.50 per person) and at Cruz Bay Visitor Center at 9:45 AM (\$1.50 per person). Return boat trip (\$3.50 per person), to Cruz Bay from Reef Bay will arrive at approximately 3:30 PM.



<u>Seashoe Walk</u>: An exciting discovery walk'n'wade along a rocky coral-strewn beach, coral flats and mangrove lagoon area. Explore this fascinating sea nursery with its numerous shallow water marine animals. Wear suitable wading shoes.

Salt Pond Hike: This hot, uphill, two mile hike to the extreme end of Ram Head includes a stop at the unique natural salt pond then continues for breath-taking views from the Ram Head cliffs. This dry cactus woodland trail emphasizes the diversity of forest types found in the tropics. Be sure to take your camera. Reservations are required (776-6201). Bus departs Cinnamon Bay Camp at 8:30 AM (\$5.00 round trip per person) and departs Salt Pond Trail at 12:30 PM for return to the Cinnamon Bay Camp.

Snorkel: Learn safe snorkeling and explore the exciting world of the coral reef. A ranger will show the many hiding places and explain the diversity of colors on the reef. For this relaxes excursion, bring mask, snorkel, fins, and a tee shirt to conserve body heat in the water and to avoid sunburn.



Brown Bay Hike: This hike takes you through the Northeastern area of the park. Beginning at Annaberg the trail travels uphill through Watermelon (Leinster Bay) Plantation with open vistas, then down through Brown Bay to Hurricane Hole. Walk along the seashore, visit an old cattle plantation with water well and drinking trough still intact. Cameras are a must for spectacular views of the British Isles. Wear ood hiking shoes and bring lunch and beverage. Reservations are reguired (776-6201). Return trip by bus (2.50 per person).

Caneel Walk: A short stroll through St. John history amid well preserved 19th century sugar mill ruins. Explore the former Peter Durloo plantation and site of the main reisitance to the 1733 slave insurrection.

Bird Walk: A walk into the avian world. This one mile walk along a mangrove swamp, acacia scrub area and salt pond affords a golden opportunity to ovserve resident and migratory birds (wading, shore, and inland). You are encouraged to bring binoculars.



Annaberg Living History: A program about the subsistence years from 1900-1935. Learn about tropical foods, and medicinal plants, weaving, baking, charcoal making, and terraced gardening. Visit with demonstrators at your leisure.

<u>Cultural Demonstration</u>: Demonstration held across the road from Cinnamon Bay Camp in the ruins. Bring your own bake goods to pop into the old outdoor wood oven. Learn West Indian cooking, baking craft, and stories.

<u>Historic Bus Tour</u>: A ranger led tour to the eastern end of St. John. Learn about the site of the earliest organized slave insurrection in the Caribbean, early boat building and Hurricane Hole. Reservations are required (776-6201). Bus transprtation (\$5.00 per person).

Evening Programs: Informal talks, slides or film presentations about plants, animals, marine life, culture, and history of the West Indies. Weekly evening program topics will be posted on bulletin boards at Cinnamon Bay, Maho Bay, and Cruz Bay.

PARK RANGERS ARE THE FRIENDLIEST, BUT...

Don't water-ski inside Park boundaries; leave your spearguns at home or outside the Park, same for metal detectors:

Campground quiet hours are 10 pm until 6 am; non-campers please leave by 9 pm; pets are not allowed in the campground or on the beaches.

Please leave natural features such as corals, plants, etc. in place and un damaged for others to enjoy. Help keep St. John beautiful and litter free.

HAVE A SAFE VISIT ...

While snorkeling and swimming: Stay out of heavy surf; know your abilities and how to use your snorkel gear; avoid spiny sea urchins, and fire coral; avoid scraping against coral formations. Do not snorkel alone.

Check for lifeguarded beaches. Too much sun exposure can be painful and dangerous.

While hiking; Tell someone where you are going.

Carry a map, water and food; wear proper clothing and hiking shoes. Leave unidentified fruits alone. Avoid walking or climbing on historical ruins and structures. Do not hike alone.
