Learn about the past

At War in the Pacific National Historical Park, the former battlefields, gun emplacements, trenches, and historic structures all serve as silent reminders of the bloody World War II battles that took place on Guam in 1944. This national park was created to honor all those who participated in the campaigns of the Pacific Theater of World War II and to conserve and to interpret the natural, scenic, and historic values and objects on the island of Guam for future generations.



Enjoy the natural wonders

The park also protects 1,000 acres of submerged lands at Asan Beach and Agat, habitat for dolphins, sea turtles, and over 200 species of beautiful coral. Another 800 acres of native limestone forest and savannah grasslands are conserved in the rugged inland units of Asan, Mt. Alifan, and Mt. Chachao/Tenjo, while the Piti Guns are set in a historic mahogany forest.
