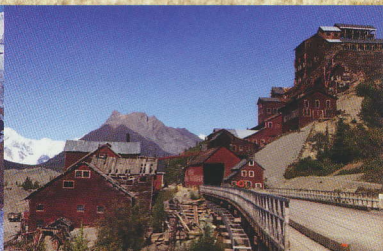

Kennicott Glacier Lodge

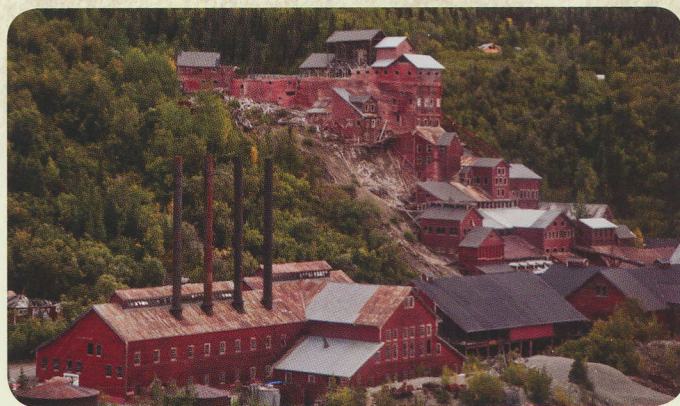

- The only Lodge located in the historic town of Kennicott; Alaskan family owned and operated since 1987.

National Historic Landmark



1901 — Copper is discovered in Kennicott and development begins on what would become the richest copper mine in the world.

1911 — The first load of copper departs Kennicott on the newly-built 193 mile railroad to Cordova.

Kennicott is the most technologically advanced town in Alaska featuring a modern hospital, steam-heated walkways, and a 14-story wooden mill building to process the copper ore.

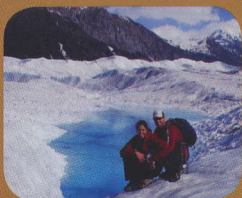
1938 — The mine ceases to be financially viable and when the last train leaves Kennicott in November, the town is abandoned overnight.

1986 — Congress recognizes Kennicott as a National Historic Landmark.

TODAY — The National Park Service is actively stabilizing and restoring the historic mining buildings.



Kennicott Activities



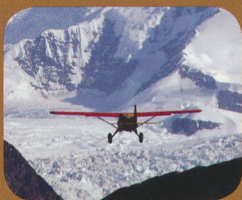
Glacier Hiking

Take a walk on the Root Glacier, one of the few easily accessible glaciers in Alaska, and see moulons, fathomless blue pools, crevasses, and maybe even an ice cave.



Explore Historic Kennicott

Step back in time as you wander through the historic copper mining town. Several buildings are now open to the public and guided tours are available daily.



Flightseeing
