


Wrangell-St. Elias

Diverse wildlife, including Dall sheep, grizzly bears, caribou, moose, salmon, and trumpeter swans thrive in this, our nation's largest National Park.

Steaming Mt. Wrangell, an active volcano, and nine of the 16 highest peaks in the U.S. form the backdrop for the vigorous story of plate tectonics and volcanism still unfolding here.

More than just a National Park, Wrangell-St. Elias, along with Glacier Bay, Kluane National Park, and Tatshenshini-Alsek Provincial Park make up a 24 million acre World Heritage Site, one of the largest protected areas on earth.
