GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING CAMPGROUND USE

CAMPING LIMITATIONS

July 1 to Labor Day - 14 days either in a single period or combined separate periods

Labor Day to June 30 - 30 days

CAMPING AND SANITATION

Campers shall keep their campsites clean. Combustible rubbish shall be burned in campfires and all other garbage and refuse placed in receptacles provided for the purpose.

The drainage or dumping of refuse from any trailer or pickup camper, except in places or receptacles provided for such purpose, is prohibited. All campers shall carry their waste water to the nearest restroom for disposal.

The cleaning of fish or the washing of clothing at campground hydrants is prohibited.

Quiet is maintained between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

The operation of motor-driven power generators or similar noise-producing motors or machinery is permitted only in the Mammoth, Canyon, Fishing Bridge, Bridge Bay, Grant Village, Old Faithful and Madison campgrounds.

Campers shall not leave their camps unattended for more than 24 hours without special permission of a Park Ranger.

A commercial trailer park at Fishing Bridge, which operates from approximately June 15 to September 15, provides water, sewer, and power hookups at a rate of \$2.50 per day. Reservations may be made by writing to Hamilton Stores, Inc., West Yellowstone, Montana 59758.

FOOD STORAGE SUGGESTIONS FOR CAMPERS

Any food or food container that emits an odor, or is left on tables or in open boxes, or any garbage is a definite invitation to bear damage. Generally, campers who keep a clean camp are less bothered by bears.

- 1. Food should not be stored on a table or in your tent.
- 2. Seal surplus food in clean wrapping material or in airtight containers.
- 3. Keep your food as cool as possible.
- 4. Your car trunk is one of the best food storage places.
- 5. Report all bear damage and injuries to a Park Ranger.

FIRES

In public campgrounds, build fires only in the regular fireplaces. Fires shall be completely extinguished when the campsite is left unattended.

Fire permits are required for fires in back-country and wilderness locations.

The use or possession of fireworks and firecrackers is prohibited.

PETS

All pets must be on leash, crated, or otherwise under physical restrictive control at all times.

LOST ARTICLES

Persons finding lost articles should deposit them at the nearest ranger station, leaving their own names and addresses. Articles not claimed by the owner within 60 days shall be returned to the finder.
