GRAND TETON NATIONAL PARK AND JOHN D. ROCKEFELLER, JR., MEMORIAL PARKWAY



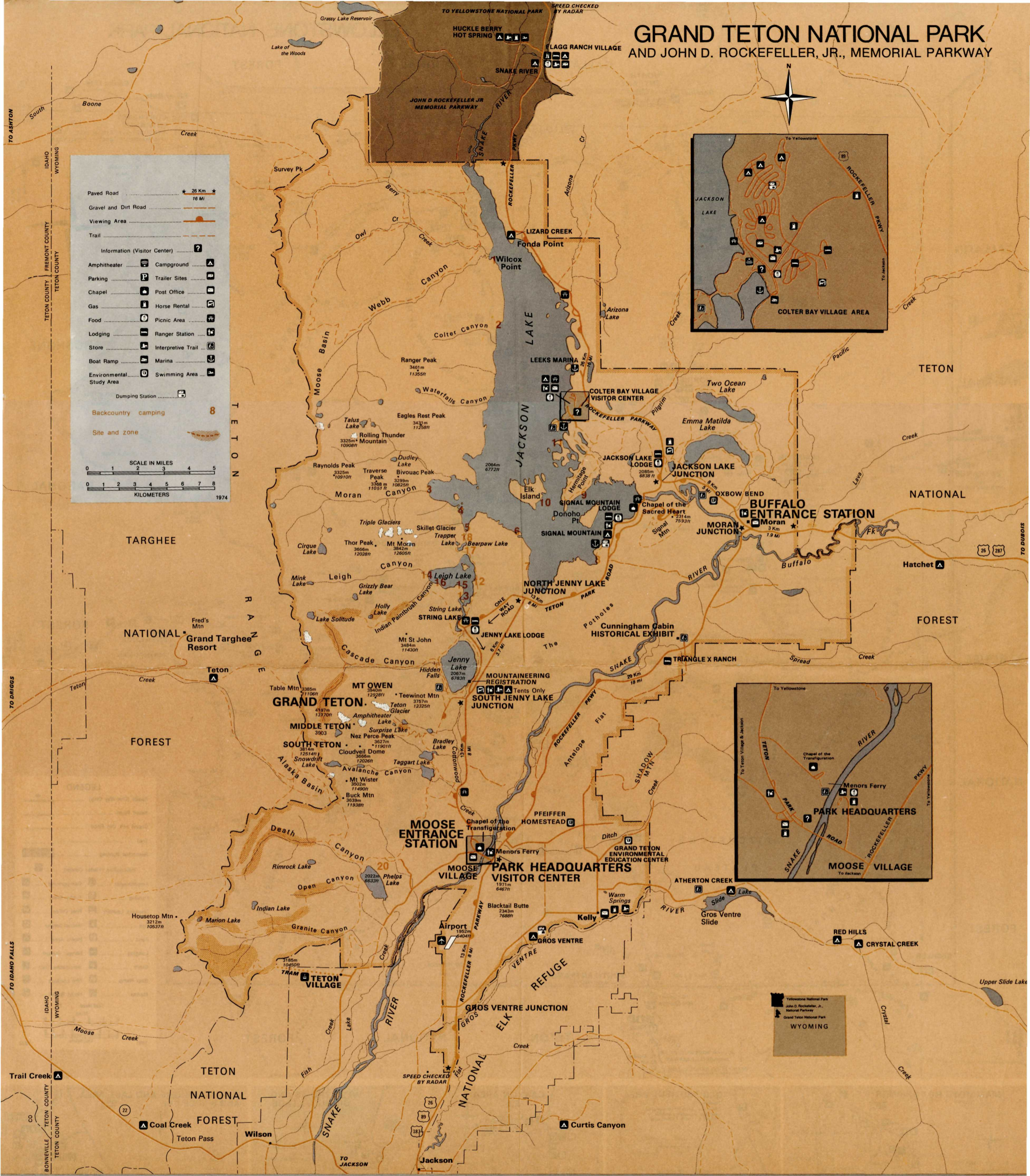

PERTINENT VISITOR INFORMATION

These maps are intended as handy road guides to Yellowstone and Grand Teton National Parks and to the John D. Rockefeller, Jr., Memorial Parkway. Visitor centers in both national parks provide detailed information on camping, hiking, medical care, interpretive activities, and for all available services. Rangers throughout the parks and at ranger stations will render whatever assistance they can. All facilities are open in the summer, but during the rest of the year services are provided on a limited basis.

IN YELLOWSTONE: Visitor centers are at Mammoth, Norris, Madison, Old Faithful, Grant Village, Fishing Bridge, and Canyon. Mammoth and Old Faithful are open in winter. Tune your radio to 1606 for information about different areas in the park. For emergencies dial 911 or 344-7381. In summer, medical assistance is available at the Lake Hospital, Mammoth Clinic, and Old Faithful Clinic.

IN GRAND TETON: Visitor centers are at Colter Bay Village and Moose Village, which is open all year. Call Dial-A-Park, 733-2220, for recorded information on weather, activities, and available facilities. This number also gives information for the Rockefeller Parkway. Grocery stores and service stations are at Flagg Ranch Village, Colter Bay, Signal Mountain, Moose Village, and Kelly. The Rockefeller Parkway runs from West Thumb in Yellowstone to the south boundary of Grand Teton and includes the corridor of land between the two parks. The parkway honors John D.

Rockefeller, Jr., whose contributions as a conservationist include Acadia, Great Smoky Mountains, Grand Teton, and Virgin Islands National Parks, and the Blue Ridge Parkway.
