



PUBLIC CAMPGROUND INFORMATION
YOSEMITE NATIONAL PARK



TICKETRON RESERVATIONS are required for campsites in Yosemite Valley's auto campgrounds year-round, for Hodgdon Meadow and Crane Flat Campgrounds from spring through fall and for Tuolumne Meadows Campground from summer through fall. Campground reservations may be made up to, but no more than, eight weeks in advance of your visit, in person at any Ticketron outlet nationwide or by mail through Ticketron's mail order department. Reservations CANNOT be made by telephone. All other campgrounds (except group campgrounds) are operated on a first-come, first-served basis.

CAMPING LIMITS: From June 1 - September 15 there is a seven day camping limit in Yosemite Valley and a 14 day limit outside the Valley. From September 16 - May 31 the limit is 30 days throughout the Park. Thirty total camping days per calendar year are permitted in the Park. A maximum of six people or immediate family (mother, father and dependent children) is allowed per campsite. All campsites must be vacated by 12 noon on the day of departure. Please leave your site clean for the next visitor.

CAMPGROUND RULES AND REGULATIONS: CAMPING IS ALLOWED IN DESIGNATED CAMPSITES ONLY. It is the camper's responsibility to know and abide by all Park rules and regulations.

BEARS: The entire park is bear habitat and federal law requires that all food be properly stored in your vehicle, or bear-proof food storage locker where available, at all times. Failure to do so may result in a fine and/or impounding of your food. If you do not have a vehicle in which to store your food, please ask a Park Ranger for instructions.

PETS are permitted in designated campgrounds or campground sections only and must on a leash no longer than six feet in length at all times. Pets may not be left unattended. PETS ARE NOT ALLOWED ON ANY PARK TRAILS.

FIREWOOD may be purchased in Yosemite Valley, Wawona, Crane Flat, White Wolf and Tuolumne Meadows. Dead and down wood for campfires may be gathered in the Park except in sequoia groves. Power saws may not be used. Beginning in 1989, the collection of firewood in Yosemite Valley may be prohibited by federal law from June through September. Fires are allowed only in established fire sites. Do not build your own fire rings.

TREES: Protect them and do not damage trees by placing knives, axes or nails into them.

PARKING/VEHICLES: All vehicles, including tent and utility trailers, must be parked on the designated parking pads for each campsite. Vehicles may not be driven off the roadway. Campers in Yosemite Valley with more vehicles than will fit on the assigned parking pad may park at Curry Village. Motorcycles, trailbikes, and minibikes must be licensed, ridden only on roads where automobiles travel, and must be operated by persons possessing a valid driver's license. Bicycles are permitted only on paved bikeways and roadways.

WASTEWATER may be dumped into utility drains. No water may be drained onto the ground.

QUIET HOURS are from 10:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m. in the campgrounds. Quiet generators may be used sparingly during daylight hours.

PROPERTY: Do not leave valuables unattended. Report suspicious activity to a Park Ranger.

EMERGENCIES: DIAL 911. No coins are needed in pay phones.

CAMPER SERVICES: Sanitary dump stations are located in Yosemite Valley at Upper Pines and Lower River Campgrounds, in Wawona and at Tuolumne Meadows. Hook-ups are not available in any of Yosemite's campgrounds. Groceries are available year-round in Yosemite Valley and Wawona, and limited supplies are available seasonally at other park locations. Shower facilities are available for public use at Curry Village and Housekeeping Camp, and at White Wolf, Tuolumne Meadows and Wawona during the summer months. Swimming pools with shower facilities are available at Curry Village, Yosemite Lodge and Wawona Hotel. Laundry facilities are available at Housekeeping Camp from spring through fall. Consult the Visitor Center for winter hours.
